White is not a colour. Red and white=pink Red and blue=purple Red and yellow=orange Yellow and blue =green Tinting means to lighten a colour by adding white. Shading means to darken a colour by adding black. Tone refers to the lightness or darkness of colours. Wassily Kandinsky if famous for the Concentric Circles. Mondrian is famous for his rectangles and squares painted in primary colours. Wassily Kandinsky believed music affected the painting. Henry Matisse did the collage of the snail at age 83. A loom is wooden and used to weave cloth and tapestry. African sculptures did not survive because they were made of wood. Paul Klee made pictures of cities using coloured rectangles. William Morris' designs became and remain a popular choice for wallpaper. Salt dough requires plain flour, salt and water. Picasso is the Spanish painter who categorised his work into periods. Cross Stitch, Overstitch and Running stitch are three types of stitches. Military hats show rank. The Queen's guards wear a bearskin hat. At Royal Ascot men wear top hats. A HB is a writing pencil. Who painted the Sistine Chapel ceiling?</p>	<p>The origin of collage: Italian portrait painters had pasted small pieces of chain, gilded paper, and sometimes real stones and jewels onto their canvases. Mixed Media means to combine different art material in your artwork. Tessellation means an arrangement of shapes closely fitted together, especially of polygons in a repeated pattern without gaps or overlapping. Plein-air painting means starting and finishing a painting outside in front of the subject. The term 'Textile' is a Latin word originated from the word 'texere' which means 'to weave'. Banksy is famous for graffiti art. Calligraphy means the art of producing decorative handwriting or lettering with a pen or brush. Pointillism is a technique using tiny dots of various pure colours, which become blended in the viewer's eye. Van Gogh's work became famous after he died. Van Gogh painted the Sunflowers. Freida Kahlo was a Mexican artist who did a lot of self-portraits. Freida Kahlo is described as a surrealist or magic realist artist because her pictures have something odd in them such as monkeys in her self portraits. Psychedelic art was introduced and became popular in the sixties. Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein were two famous pop artists in America. The Renaissance was a period in European history marking the transition from the Middle Ages to Modernity and covering the 15th and 16th centuries. Leonardo Davinci painted the Mona Lisa. Expressionism began at the beginning of the 20th century. In Cubist artwork, objects are analysed, broken up and reassembled in an abstracted form—instead of depicting objects from a single viewpoint, the artist depicts the subject from a different viewpoint to it was founded by Picasso. Surrealism is a cultural movement that started in 1917. Artists painted unnerving, illogical scenes, sometimes with photographic precision, creating strange creatures from everyday objects. Edward Hopper painted Nighthawks. Conceptual art is when ideas involved in the work are more important than aesthetic, technical, and material concerns. In conceptual art the idea is the most important aspect of the work. Tracey Emin is a Contemporary Artist. The faux calligraphy technique (Hand Lettering) is an art form where each letter or word is sketched by hand. Henry Rousseau never saw a jungle but did a lot of paintings on the subject. A diorama is a model representing Avant Garde new and experimental ideas and methods in art, music, or literature. Conceptual art is when ideas involved in the work are more important than aesthetic, technical, and material concerns. In conceptual art the idea is the most important aspect of the work. Vintage means denoting something from the past of high quality, especially something representing the best of its kind.
