



Indoor Climbing

Spotlight Session: The Maze

These are one-hour sessions which are designed to challenge children to think about life outside their normal environment.

Children are encouraged to consider issues such as decision making, friendship, self-esteem, communication and trust. Spotlight sessions promote SMSC (spiritual, moral, social and cultural development).

This activity is designed to get individuals to think about how the decisions they make in life can have consequences for themselves and others. Using a purpose built maze, teams will take on a variety of challenges and games to see how they deal with the possibility of dead ends, time pressures and the competition from others. They will collect puzzle pieces around the maze to make up phrases and sentences that are incorporated in the main story telling.

Campfire

Weather permitting, children will be given the opportunity to get together as a group around a campfire at the end of the day.


This is a great activity for the children to find out new things about each other.

Cost

- The cost of the residential trip is £240
- This includes accommodation, transport, meals and the activities mentioned

- Payment can be made in three instalments:
- Instalment 1: £80 Due by Tuesday 16th December, 2025
- Instalment 2 £80 Due by Friday 20th March, 2026
- Instalment 3 £80 Due by Friday 26th June, 2026
- Payments are non-refundable

Timings

- On Wednesday 18th November, your child will need to arrive at school by 8.30am.
- On Friday 20th November, your child will return to school ready to collected by approximately 1.30pm. On the day, a message will be sent out to parents/carers to give any updates if delays are anticipated.

<u>Interest</u>

- Unfortunately, if there is insufficient interest, the residential visit will not go ahead.
- Once we have received final numbers, we will be assigned accommodation. If children choose to join after this, it is unlikely that we will be able to accommodate this.
